# COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic Fact Sheet

## PROVINCIAL CLINICS

- 1) All people age 12+ can register for appointments.
- 2) Locations will be confirmed when booked. Some will be for Indigenous clients only.
- 3) Clinics will continue as needed.
- 4) Organized by regional health authorities with planning support from FNHA regional teams.

## FNHA COMMUNITY-BASED CLINICS

- 1) Second-dose clinics\* underway.
- 2) First Nations Communities and Health Centres will notify community members. Some may require appointments. Everyone living in community age 12+.
- 3) All first-dose clinics for those 18+ have taken place. More are being scheduled for those who missed the first round and for ages 12-17.
- 4) Organized by the FNHA in partnership with First Nations communities.

\* Clinics are held and intended for First Nations people living in community (i.e., on reserve). Nation members should not travel to attend these clinics, however some are open to members who live off reserve but nearby.



## PROVINCIAL VACCINE REGISTRATION CONTACT INFORMATION

In order to register online, you must provide your first and last name, date of birth, postal code, your Personal Health Number and an email address or a phone number that can receive text messages.

After registering, confirmation via email or text should come within 15-30 minutes, but could take up to 24 hours.

You can also register by phone at **1-833-838-2323**. Phone lines are open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., every day, with reduced hours on statutory holidays.

## YOUR SECOND DOSE

The time between the first and second doses is approximately 16 weeks. The FNHA is now rolling out second-dose clinics in community. Those who received their first dose through the provincial registration system will be notified when it is time to get their second dose.

It's important to get both doses of the vaccine as the two doses make up what's known as one "primary series" that will provide the strongest, and longest, possible protection. The Pfizer, Moderna and AstraZeneca vaccines all require two doses to complete the primary series. The second dose provides higher overall protection against COVID-19.
