Criteria

Please review the following criteria before submitting an application for the 2024 International Overdose Awareness Day (IOAD) Community Grants

- The grants are intended to support events and initiatives that encourage First Nations communities in BC to join together to work toward ending toxic drug poisonings, de-stigmatize substance use, and remember those lost to the toxic drug emergency with an acknowledgement event on or around IOAD on Aug. 31;
- 2. Activities must be conducted through methods that ensure safety, and in partnership with First Nations leaders and health workers in the field of harm reduction and toxic drug poisoning response;
- 3. Eligible recipients include First Nations communities, First Nations Health Service Organizations, and First Nations-led organizations that provide wellness and harm reduction services to First Nations people in BC. Single grants of up to \$2,000 are available to eligible recipients. Completion of a brief closing report will be required to capture the highlights of your initiative. As we are working with a specific funding amount, as we process applications priority will be given to First Nations communities and First Nations Health Service Organizations.
- 4. Applicants must demonstrate meaningful and culturally safe partnership with First Nations communities when applying for these funds. Recipients are encouraged to collaborate with neighboring communities and First Nations organizations where feasible (e.g., if communities from the same Nation apply for separate grants but collaborate together to collectively host a larger event).
